<p>Course Description: <i>The Cybersecurity Capstone program explores the dynamic field of cybersecurity, focusing on the technologies, tools, and practices used to identify, prevent, and respond to threats, attacks, and vulnerabilities. The course covers key cybersecurity domains including Threats, Attacks, and Vulnerabilities; Technologies and Tools; Architecture and Design; Identity and Access Management; Risk Management; Cryptography and Public Key Infrastructure (PKI); and computer networking as it applies to cybersecurity. Prior coursework in forensics or a teacher's recommendation is strongly recommended before enrolling in this class.</i></p>
